The girls reflected on their mistakes and made a comeback by winning Evergreen Secondary school to emerge third in the zone

In the North Zone semi-finals, our Volleyball B division boys lost the match against Presbyterian High School (PHS) with a score of 1-2. The team lost the 1st set to PHS but they fought back to win the 2nd set. In the 3rd set, our boys were tied

with PHS at a deuce (24-24) before PHS finally won the match with a score of 29-27. Although the boys were upset, they persevered and emerged victorious against Xinmin Secondary School in the finals, gaining our school a third placing in the zone.

Although newly established in 2016, our Environment Club members have been very active, tapping on various opportunities to advocate their conservation messages and to contribute to saving the environment.

Our members participated in training by PUB and NEA on strategies to conserve water and electricity. They learnt that if we leave electronic devices plugged to electrical sockets with the switch left on, energy is being still being consumed even though the devices are not being used.
