






What is Subject-Based Banding (SBB)?

Every student is unique and possesses different strengths. Taking subjects at a more demanding level can help students <u>nurture their strengths</u> and give them <u>more opportunities</u> throughout their educational journey, so that they are <u>more</u> <u>engaged in learning</u>.





Offering Subjects at More Demanding Levels

At the start of Secondary One:



Students can be offered **English Language**, **Mother Tongue Languages**, **Mathematics and/or Science**, at the start of Secondary 1 at a more demanding level if they meet the eligibility criteria based on PSLE grades.

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Benefits of Taking Subjects at a More Demanding Level

- Personalised to individual strengths Students learn at a level that

- Greater flexibility for the future Opens up broader subject combinations and pathways in secondary school and beyond, providing more options for academic and career interests.
- Builds confidence and essential skills Develops critical thinking, problem-solving abilities and resilience through appropriate challenge, preparing students well for future learning.

Other Opportunities to Take Subjects at More Demanding Levels (Lower Secondary)

- Beyond the start of Sec 1, students can also offer subjects (English Language, Mathematics, Science and/or Mother Tongue Languages) at a more demanding level, from Sec 1 Semester 2 / Sec 2 Semester 1.
- You will receive a Parents Gateway (PG) notification if your child/ward meets the following criteria:
 - 75% or higher in the specific subject;
 - Positive learning attitude to cope with the higher academic demand
- Our school will provide support through bridging programmes for students offering these subjects at a more demanding level.

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Offering Subjects at More Demanding Levels

Beyond the start of Secondary One

From Secondary 2 (S2), students will also be able to offer Humanities subjects (Geography, History, and Literature in English) at a more demanding level. The criteria for taking Humanities at a more demanding level will be based on students' aptitude for and interest in these subjects at Sec 1.

Offering Subjects at More Demanding Levels at Upper Secondary (Humanities)

Eligibility criteria for taking subjects at a more demanding level at upper secondary:

Students could take up Humanities subject(s) at a more demanding level from Sec 3 if they are deemed able to cope with the subject based on the following criteria:

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Singapore-Cambridge Secondary Education Certificate (SEC) examinations

- From 2027, graduating students will sit for the Singapore-Cambridge Secondary Education Certificate (SEC) examinations, at their respective subject levels (i.e. G1, G2, G3).
- No change to the examination format
- SEC Examination Timetable
 - Sept Written examinations for English Language and Mother Tongue Languages
 - Oct-Nov 1 common exam period for rest of the subjects
 - Only 1 written examination sitting for all MTL subject levels (i.e. G1, G2, G3 MTL and G3 Higher MTL).
 - 1 common result release held in January of the following year







Recent changes to Post-Secondary Admission Criteria

From the <u>2028 Joint Admissions Exercise</u> (JAE), MOE will reduce the number of subjects required for JC admission from six to five, by shifting from the current L1R5 (six subjects) gross aggregate score to L1R4 (five subjects).

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
The cap on bonus points for JC admission will be lowered from a maximum of 4 to 3 points to account for the reduction in the number of subjects included in the L1R4 aggregate computation.

Additional 2 bonus points are still awarded if a student has applied and is selected for the Chinese, Malay, or Tamil Language Elective Programme.

Polytechnic Year 1 Admission Criteria From the <u>2028 intake</u>, students can offer one [B] subject taken at either G2 or G3 in their aggregate score. The remaining four subjects must continue to be offered at G3 to ensure that students can cope with the academic rigour in the polytechnics.



Polytechnic Year 1 Admission Criteria Take note of the poly aggregate type and MER of the course. Eg. if Math is required to be computed as one of the <u>relevant subjects</u>, Math has to be taken at G3, unless the student has another R subject that can be used for A type courses.

*English must also be taken at G3 as EL is compulsory for aggregate score computation.

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Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

Starting from the <u>Academic Year 2026 intake</u>, admissions to the PFP will be restructured to a <u>cluster-based approach</u>. Students in the PFP can enter one of three key broad clusters: (i) Sciences (ii) Design, Engineering & Technology or (iii) Humanities, Art, Media and Business, before being posted to a specific diploma course based on their interest and PFP performance. Diploma-specific admission will apply for the Diploma in Nursing, Diploma in Early Childhood Development & Education and Diploma in Tamil Studies with Early Education.

Starting from the <u>Academic Year 2028 intake</u>, the PFP will be expanded to also allow students taking G3 subjects, or a mix of G2 and G3 subjects to access PFP by mapping their G3 grade to the G2 equivalent – thus removing the current stream-based admission which is limited to today's N(A) students.

Starting from the <u>Academic Year 2028</u>, the admission requirements for direct entry into Year 2 for all Higher Nitec courses will be set at G2. This means that students taking a combination of G3 and G2 subjects can apply for direct entry into Year 2 of Higher Nitec, as long as their gross ELMAB3 aggregate score is 19 points or better.

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Admission to Post-Secondary Education Institutions (PSEIs)

Criteria to fulfil

- Meeting Minimum Entry Requirements (MER) for each course/institution
- Gross/net aggregate score threshold for each institution, eg. L1R4 of 16 points for JC (gross), ELR2B2 of 22 points for Polytechnic (net) etc
- Cut-off points for each course/institution (using previous year's COP as a gauge) this will not be required in the case of DSA and EAE successful applicants

G2 Grade 6 and G1 Grade E will continue to be <u>disallowed</u> for fulfillment of MERs for prerequisite subjects for Higher Nitec courses at ITE



What if my child struggles with the subject at the more demanding level?

- > Students are encouraged to continue with the subjects at the more demanding level until the end of Sec 2, as students need time to adjust to the higher academic demands.
- > Our school will monitor the students' progress in the subjects at the more demanding level as well as overall progress in all the other subjects.
- > Our school is mindful of students' socio-emotional and academic needs and will endeavour to provide the necessary support to students to help them cope.





Will my child continue with the subject(s) at the more demanding level all the way to Sec 4?

> Your child may continue with the corresponding subject(s) at the more demanding level at upper secondary if he/she meets our school's criteria at the end of Sec 2 (at least 50% for the subject).
