


Subject-Based Banding (SBB) Briefing 2024





What is Subject-Based Banding (SBB)?

Every student is unique and possesses different strengths. Taking subjects at a more demanding level can help students nurture their strengths and give them more opportunities throughout their educational journey, so that they are more engaged in learning.





Offering Subjects at More Demanding Levels

At the start of Secondary One:



Students can be offered **English Language**, **Mother Tongue Languages**, **Mathematics and/or Science**, at the start of Secondary 1 at a more demanding level if they meet the eligibility criteria based on PSLE grades.

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Offering Subjects at More Demanding Levels

Beyond the start of Secondary One

From Secondary 2 (S2), students will also be able to offer **Humanities subjects** (Geography, History, and Literature in English) at a more demanding level. The criteria for taking Humanities at a more demanding level will be based on students' aptitude for and interest in these subjects at Sec 1.

Other Opportunities to Take Subjects at More Demanding Level (Lower Secondary)

- Beyond the start of Sec 1, students can also take subjects (English Language, Mathematics, Science and/or Mother Tongue Languages) at a more demanding level, from Sec 1 Semester 2 / Sec 2 Semester 1.
- Eligible students will receive an application form via PG either after mid-year or after the year-end examinations, based on the following criteria:
 - 75% or higher in the specific subject;
 - Positive learning attitude to cope with the higher academic demand
- Our school will provide support through bridging programmes for these new SBB students.

Offering Subjects at More Demanding Levels at Upper Secondary (Humanities)

Eligibility criteria for taking subjects at a more demanding level at upper secondary:

Subject level for upper secondary

Students could take up Humanities subject(s) at a more demanding level from Sec 3 if they are deemed able to cope with the subject based on the following criteria:

What are the possible benefits of taking subjects at a more demanding level?

- > Some students (and parents) have shared that SBB allows the students to challenge themselves, and to have more options for Sec 3 subject combinations and post-secondary courses.
- > A strong foundation in literacy, numeracy and reasoning, would ensure students are better prepared for various post-secondary progression pathways (e.g. to ITE and Polytechnic).




Eligibility Criteria and Opting into SBB

The infographic includes a footnote (*For students who meet ITE's Year 1 academic requirements) which states that entry into ITE Year 2 for students with 4 G1 subjects depends on them meeting ITE's academic requirements in Year 1.

Students who offer 4 G1 subjects may first progress to Year 1 of the 3-year Higher Nitec. Those who meet academic requirements during their Year 1 Semester 1 examinations may be offered the option for in-flight acceleration, which allows direct progression directly to Year 2 in the following semester.



Admissions to Polytechnic Year 1

- From 2028, one 'Best' [B] subject can be fulfilled at G2 or G3 as part of the aggregate score for admission to Polytechnic Year 1
 - Students who offer both [B] subjects at G3 will have the [B] subject with a lower grade mapped from G3 to G2 based on a grade mapping table.
 - Correspondingly, the net aggregate cutoff will be adjusted from 26 points to 22 points.

What if my child struggles with the subject at more demanding level?

- > Students are encouraged to continue with the subjects at the more demanding level until the end of Sec 2, as students need time to adjust to the higher academic demands.
- Our school will monitor the students' progress in the subjects at the more demanding level as well as overall progress in all the other subjects.
- > Our school is mindful of students' socio-emotional and academic needs and will endeavour to provide the necessary support to students to help them cope.





Will my child continue with the subject(s) at the more demanding level all the way to Sec 4?

➤ Your child may continue with the corresponding subject(s) at the more demanding level at upper secondary if he/she meets our school's criteria at the end of Sec 2 (at least 50% for the subject).



Buying of books for SBB

- Students opting to take subject at a more demanding level need to <u>only buy</u> the relevant books for the subject/level.
- Once parents have decided on taking up the SBB option and indicated the option via Parents Gateway, parents may proceed to order the books online or head to the school bookshop to purchase the books.
